Light weight types saw prices to £500 for a 12yo Thorough bred horse still proving hard to find homes for. The Show hunter pony that was advertised on the internet the day before the sale realised £390 it looked a real bargain.

A registered Section A colt 3years old made £100. A Registered HACKNEY Ride & Drive topped at £500. An 8yo Chestnut Gelding that wanted a little work as he'd had the winter off realised £170. An aged 14.2hh very well bred barren mare realised £250.

If your thinking of investing some money this could be the commodity to invest in, round the corner is spring Green fields and sunshine just the time when people want to own all types of equine.

Saddlery English Saddles topped at £220 from £18 for a pony pad, Bridles sold to £45.

Top of the tree today went to one of an entry 8 from Holland a very impressive 4yo 16.2hh Friesian Stallion realising £2500. Next a Coloured 12year old 16.1hh Gelding at £1500. A good all round 13hh 6yo Black Mare topped at £500. A coloured Gelding 'happy hacker' saw bids to £760, thorough bred's topped at £400. A registered Shetland 3yo chestnut colt reached £55 and his Black mate similar at £45 (not registered). A 11mo section D colt topped at £135 and a Section C 9mo colt realised £110.
